SHINE in Haiti - 2013

The General Conference is pleased to announce plans for the distribution of funds received for disaster relief in Haiti. They include medical and dental missions through CoG7's own SHINE team, as well as collaboration with other ministries and relief organizations already active in Haiti.

Initially, disbursement of these funds was delayed due to concerns about corruption and government bureaucracy in Haiti. Other non-profits report that their Haiti relief funds too are being held, pending assurance that their use accomplishes real and lasting relief. Since those initial concerns, the delay has been largely due to the need to honor donor intent by making sure that these funds are used solely for the purpose for which they were given.

SHINE will minister in Haiti March 25 – April 1, 2013. Those who wish to participate must submit a completed application by December 17. Visit the SHINE website for more information: *shinecog7.org*.

Your prayers for this effort are appreciated, your participation encouraged. The Church-at-large will be kept posted of the ongoing progress of this mission. May many experience Christ's love and compassion — even saving faith — as a result.



ASLEEP IN JESUS

Delvin L. O'Banion

Long-time G. C. minister Delvin L. O'Banion passed away August 19, 2012, after a brief illness. He was born in Gentry County, Missouri, July 26, 1924, and grew up in the Stanberry area. After graduating from high school, Elder O'Banion served in the US Army during World War II, which



After college, participating in an evangelistic tour throughout the US both confirmed his desire to make the gospel ministry his life's work, and led to his marriage to Wilma Presler of Colorado on July 25, 1954. They had three children: Dennis O'Banion (Conroe, Texas); Wanda Taylor (Independence, Missouri); and Phyllis Tuller (Colorado, deceased). Elder O'Banion's ministerial service included pastorates in Fresno, California; Denver, Colorado; Eureka, South Dakota; New Auburn, Wisconsin; McAlester, Shawnee, and Oklahoma City, Oklahoma; and Joplin, Missouri. He also served on the General Conference's board of directors and as a Central District superintendent and member of the License and Credentials Committee. Elder O'Banion loved the Lord, loved the Church, and loved to serve, and he endeared himself to many through his caring ways and sense of humor. During his retirement years, Elder O'Banion kept busy delivering pizza, driving an airport shuttle, cleaning computers, and working for an insurance company, which he used as an opportunity to share his faith with others.

He is survived by his two children, eight grand-children, and ten great-grandchildren. A funeral service was held in Denver, Colorado, Friday, August 24, 2012, with interment in the Eastern Plains of Colorado. An additional memorial service was held in Missouri on September 8. Elder O'Banion's service, warmth, and love for the Lord Jesus will long be remembered by the leaders and members of the General Conference.


October is Clergy Appreciation Month
